THE CHALLENGE

- 14.5% of our population is food insecure with 21,410 people not knowing where their next meal will come from *

OUR IMPACT

- More than 1.4 million meals were provided to children, families and seniors in need
- Services were also provided to address long term needs and guide people toward self reliance



IMPROVING EDUCATION

When children can learn and grow at the appropriate level, they are more likely to graduate on time and become employable.



THE CHALLENGE

- 42% of Martin County students are not reading on level by the end of third grade, a critical transition when students make the leap from learning to read, to reading to learn *

OUR IMPACT

- 14,680 hours of summer instruction were provided by certified teachers to children at risk of falling behind
- 68% of Summer Slide participants at school sites showed improvement in reading compared to 42 % overall



PROMOTING GOOD HEALTH

Promoting healthy behaviors and increasing access to primary and preventative health care and mental health services enhance the quality of life and overall health of our economy and the community.



THE CHALLENGE

- 12.2% of Martin County children are uninsured, higher than the state at 11.1% *
- 68.3% of Martin County mothers received pre-natal care in the first trimester compared to 79.9% in Florida **

OUR IMPACT

- 11,400 doctor and dental visits, vision and hearing exams, and medications were provided to uninsured children in Martin County
- 370 babies were born healthy because of pre-natal care and delivery services



STRENGTHENING FAMILIES

Preventing and reducing youth substance abuse and risky behaviors leads to healthier outcomes for children, families and the entire community.



THE CHALLENGE

- 19.5% of Martin County middle and high school students reported in 2014 that they had used alcohol, tobacco or other drugs in the past 30 days *
- In Martin County, the suicide death rate is 21.5 per 100,000 populationhigher than the rate of 15.0 in Florida **

OUR IMPACT

- 10,080 hours of substance abuse counseling were provided to children and teens

SUPPORTING FINANCIAL STABILITY

The future success of our community is directly tied to the financial stability of working families. When this population suffers and is forced to make difficult choices, we all face serious consequences.



THE CHALLENGE

- 45% of Martin County residents are struggling to afford the basic necessities of housing, child care, food, health care and transportation *
- * ALICE Report, a 2014 study of financial hardship by Rutgers University

OUR IMPACT

- 339 low-to-moderate income individuals and families received a total of \$327,488 in refunds through the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program
- 21,600 hours of vocational skills training were provided to teens and young adults



ENSURING SAFETY

A safe community builds a vibrant community. In a community without child abuse, neglect and domestic violence, everyone is able to reach their full potential.



THE CHALLENGE

- Total reported cases of domestic violence in Martin County is 357 per 100,000 population *
- The rate of child abuse/neglect in Martin County was 8.1 per 1,000 youth **

53,290 nights of safe shelter were provided to people in need

THE GOLDEN GATE HISTORICAL CENTER FOR LEARNING AND SERVICE A glowing example of "Collective Impact"



No one organization can do it alone, but collectively we can transform a building to empower a community. Thanks to the insight and vision of an anonymous United Way donor, a collaborative group made up of House of Hope, the Martin County Library System, Habitat for Humanity, Indian River State College, Project Lift, Martin County Community Foundation, Martin County Board of County Commissioners, Martin County Community Redevelopment Agency and the United Way of Martin County has joined forces to bring to life the Golden Gate Historic Center for Learning and Service. The historic Golden Gate building will be transformed into a vibrant community center that will offer online library services and on-site educational and vocational learning opportunities. Opening is scheduled for early 2016.

Group Volunteer Projects

Martin Volunteers coordinates **GROUP VOLUNTEER PROJECTS** for businesses and national days of service. For example, in just a few hours, more than 55 volunteers packaged **14,112** meals for Martin County children in need. These packages are slipped into backpacks on Fridays to ensure children have food to eat over the weekend.

THE SENIOR CORPS RETIRED & SENIOR VOLUNTEER PROGRAM (RSVP) is open to anyone 55 or older interested in volunteering in the following outcome-based areas: literacy tutoring, disaster preparedness, ending hunger, mentoring youth, veteran employment and community safety. Volunteers receive free supplemental accident insurance while volunteering and special recognition opportunities throughout the year.

CHARACTER COUNTS! Mini-Grants

In 2014-15, CHARACTER COUNTS! awarded 15 mini-grants totaling \$10,000 to faculty and staff in the Martin County School District and United Way of Martin County affiliated agencies. Since 2007, this program has awarded \$84,000 to implement 133 individual agency, classroom, school-wide and district-wide projects which have touched the lives of more than 35,000 individuals in Martin County.
